Remembers the rapid paced work and remembers a sense of camaraderie.

TU: Worked by the hour they would make sure that we worked-At Plant 1 we never had to work by the piece. When we went to Plant 4 the men would put the baskets on and would punch-- So many baskets an hour in order to stay in the plant.

TS: Was there a minimum?

TU: Yes there was a minimum – I don't remember how much we had to make. We killed our own selves. The women would—we had a lot of pride. We would play around in the plant. We were young. We would play races. We did it to ourselves. The men--big bosses are looking: Well if she could do, she has to do it also. We have to keep up, I never could. The girls loved me and they helped me. I don't why they did.

We had fun, we had fun, we had fun. That's why I say we made a lot of friends. We were Italians, Slavs and Mexicans, no Filipinos there were no—that's all there was. As far as the ethnic, that's the way we were. And there were a few colored people, too. We all got along together fine. We laugh and kid.
